- 5. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 6. Cold and cough medicines
- 7. Vitamins
- 8. Plants
- 9. Arts and crafts products
- 10. Gastrointestinal medicines (for the stomach)

#### Most common exposures, children 6-19 years:

- 1. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 2. Antidepressants
- 3. Cold and cough medicines
- 4. (*tie*) Sleep medicines and antipsychotics Cosmetics and personal care products
- 6. Foreign bodies
- 7. (*tie*) Household cleaning products Plants
- 9. Bites and stings
- 10. Alcohols

# Most common exposures, adults 20 years and older:

- 1. Analgesics (pain relievers)
