- 7. Vitamins
- 8. Plants
- 9. Antimicrobials

Most common exposures, children 6-19 years:

- 1. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 2. Cold and cough medicines
- 3. Foreign bodies
- 4. Antidepressants
- 5. (*tie*) Cosmetics and personal care products Sleep medicines and antipsychotics
- 7. Heart medicines
- 8. (*tie*) Household cleaning products Pesticides
- 10. Antihistamines
