- 4. Foreign bodies
- 5. (*tie*) Analgesics (pain relievers) Cold and cough medicines
- 7. (*tie*) Arts and crafts products Deodorizers
- 9. (*tie*) Alcohols Plants

Most common exposures, children 6-19 years:

- 1. Lacrimators
- 2. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 3. Cold and cough medicines
- 4. Foreign bodies
- 5. (*tie*) Building and construction products Cosmetics and personal care products Fumes, gases and vapors Stimulants and street drugs
- 9. (*tie*) Antihistamines Chemicals Household cleaning products

Most common exposures, adults 20 years and older:

- 1. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 2. Household cleaning products
- 3. Sleep medicines and antipsychotics
- 4. Heart medicines
- 5. (tie) Antidepressants
