- 5. *(tie)* Cosmetics and personal care products Foreign bodies
- 7. Antidepressants
- 8. Household cleaning products
- 9. Stimulants and street drugs
- 10. Plants

Most common exposures, adults 20 years and older:

- 1. Sleep medicines and antipsychotics
- 2. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 3. Antidepressants
- 4. Alcohols
- 5. Household cleaning products
- 6. Heart medicines
- 7. Muscle relaxants
- 8. Pesticides
