Most common exposures, children 6-19 years:

- 1. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 2. Foreign bodies
- 3. Cold and cough medicines
- 4. Antidepressants
- 5. Antihistamines
- 6. *(tie)* Cosmetics and personal care products Sleep medicines and antipsychotics
- 8. (tie) Alcohols

Household cleaning products

Most common exposures, adults 20 years and older:

- 1. Sleep medicines and antipsychotics
- 2. Analgesics (pain relievers)
