- 2. *(tie)* Foreign bodies Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 4. Household cleaning products
- 5. Topical medicines (for the skin)
- 6. Vitamins
- 7. Antihistamines
- 8. *(tie)* Antimicrobials Heart medicines Electrolytes and minerals

Most common exposures, children 6-19 years:

- 1. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 2. Sleep medicines and antipsychotics
- 3. (tie) Antidepressants
 - Stimulants and street drugs
- 5. Foreign bodies
- 6. Plants
- 7. Cosmetics and personal care products
- 8. *(tie)* Antihistamines Chemicals Pesticides

Most common exposures, adults 20 years and older:

- 1. Sleep medicines and antipsychotics
- 2. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 3. Antidepressants
- 4. Alcohols
- 5. Heart medicines
- 6. Anticonvulsants
- 7. Household cleaning products
- 8. Antihistamines
- 9. Stimulants and street drugs
- 10. *(tie)* Hormones (including antidiabetic and thyroid medicines) Muscle relaxants
