- 2. Household cleaning products
- 3. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 4. Foreign bodies
- 5. Topical medicines (for the skin)
- 6. Vitamins
- 7. Electrolytes and minerals
- 8. *(tie)* Cold and cough medicines GI medicines (for the stomach)
- 10. Pesticides

## Most common exposures, children 6-19 years:

- 1. Pesticides
- 2. Cosmetics and personal care products
- 3. (tie) Analgesics (pain relievers) Household cleaning products
- 5. *(tie)* Chemicals Cold and cough medicines Foreign bodies Photographic products Stimulants and street drugs

## Most common exposures, adults 20 years and older:

- 1. Household cleaning products
- 2. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 3. Sleep medicines and antipsychotics
- 4. Cosmetics and personal care products
- 5. (tie) Alcohols Pesticides
- 7. *(tie)* Antidepressants Heart medicines
- 9. Antihistamines
- 10. (tie) Foreign bodies
