Most common exposures, children 6-19 years:

- 1. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 2. (tie) Antidepressants

Stimulants and street drugs

Household cleaning products

- 8. Sleep medicines and antipsychotics
- 9. Antihistamines

Most common exposures, adults 20 years and older:

- 2. Sleep medicines and antipsychotics
