- 1. Cosmetics and personal care products
- 2. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 3. Household cleaning products
- 4. Topical medicines (for the skin)
- 5. (tie) Foreign bodies

GI medicines (for the stomach) Vitamins

Most common exposures, children 6-19 years:

- 1. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 2. *(tie)* Antihistamines
 Bites and stings
- 4. *(tie)* Cold and cough medicines Foreign bodies

Most common exposures, adults 20-59 years:

- 1. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 2. Sleep medicines and antipsychotics
- 3. Bites and stings
- 4. Household cleaners
- 5. Alcohols

Most common exposures, adults 60 years and older:

- 1. Heart medicines
- 2. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 3. Hormones (including antidiabetic and thyroid medicines)
- 4. (tie) Bites and stings
