- 1. *(tie)* Analgesics (pain relievers)
 Sedatives and antipsychotics
- 3. *(tie)* Chemicals
 Stimulants and street drugs
- 5. Cosmetics and personal care products

Most common exposures, adults 20-59 years:

- 1. Stimulants and street drugs
- 2. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 3. Sedatives and antipsychotics
- 4. Antidepressants
- 5. Alcohols

Most common exposures, adults 60 years and older:

- 1. Anticonvulsants
- 2. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 3. Heart medicines
- 4. Antidepressants
- 5. Several substances tied with 1 exposure each

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
