Most common exposures, children 6-19 years:

- 1. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 2. Antidepressants
- 3. Stimulants and street drugs
- 4. Cosmetics and personal care products
- 5. Household cleaning products

Most common exposures, adults 20-59 years:

- 1. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 2. Sedatives and antipsychotics
- 3. *(tie)* Alcohols

- 5. (tie) Anticonvulsants

Most common exposures, adults 60 years and older:

- 1. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 2. *(tie)* Cosmetics and personal care products Heart medicines
- 4. Several substances with 1 exposure each
