1. Household cleaning products
2. (tie) Analgesics (pain relievers); Cosmetics and personal care products
4. (tie) Antimicrobials; Pesticides

Most common exposures, children 6-19 years:

1. Analgesics (pain relievers)
2. Antidepressants
3. Anticonvulsants
4. Sedatives and antipsychotics
5. (tie) Antihistamines; Heart medicines

Most common exposures, adults 20-59 years:

1. Analgesics (pain relievers)
2. Sedatives and antipsychotics
3. Antidepressants
4. Heart medicines
5. Alcohols

Most common exposures, adults 60 years and older:

1. Heart medicines
2. Analgesics (pain relievers)
3. (tie) GI medicines (for the stomach); Sedatives and antipsychotics; Topical medicines (for the skin)
