- 2. Household cleaning products
- 3. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 4. Topical medicines (for the skin)
- 5. Foreign bodies
- 6. *(tie)* Cold and cough medicines Electrolyes and minerals
- 8. Vitamins
- 9. Pesticides
- 10. Gastrointestinal medicines (for the stomach)

#### Most common exposures, children 6-19 years:

- 1. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 2. Foreign bodies
- 3. Cold and cough medicines
- 4. Cosmetics and personal care products
- 5. Sleep medicines and antipsychotics
- 6. Antihistamines
- 7. Pesticides
- 8. (tie) Anticonvulsants
  - Antidepressants Arts and crafts products Vitamins

#### Most common exposures, adults 20 years and older:

- 1. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 2. Heart medicines
- 3. Sleep medicines and antipsychotics
- 4. Antihistamines
- 5. (*tie*) Antidepressants Pesticides
- 7. (*tie*) Alcohols
  - Household cleaning products
- 9. Antimicrobials
