- 2. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 3. Household cleaning products
- 4. Foreign bodies
- 5. Arts and crafts products
- 6. Topical medicines (for the skin)
- 7. Pesticides
- 8. Gastrointestinal medicines (for the stomach)
- 9. (tie) Antihistamines Antimicrobials Alcohols

Most common exposures, children 6-19 years:

- 1. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 2. (*tie*) Cold and cough medicines Foreign bodies
- 4. (*tie*) Alcohols Antidepressants Stimulants and street drugs
- 7. (*tie*) Antihistamines
 Bites and stings
 Household cleaning products
 Cosmetics and personal care products

Most common exposures, adults 20 years and older:

- 1. Heart medicines
- 2. (tie) Analgesics (pain relievers) Household cleaning products
- 4. Sleep medicines and antipsychotics
- 5. Alcohols
- 6. Cosmetics and personal care products
- 7. Pesticides
- 8. (*tie*) Hormones Veterinary medicines
