- 2. Cosmetics and personal care products
- 3. Stimulants and street drugs
- 4. *(tie)* Antihistamines
 Household cleaning products

Most common exposures, adults 20-59 years:

- 1. Sleep medicines and antipsychotics
- 2. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 3. Alcohols
- 4. (tie) Antidepressants
 Household cleaning products
 Stimulants and street drugs

Most common exposures, adults 60 years and older:

- 1. Heart medicines
- 2. Sleep medicines and antipsychotics
- 3. Household cleaning products
- 4. *(tie)* Cosmetics and personal care products
 Hormones (including anti-diabetic and thyroid medicines)
