- 2. Cosmetics and personal care products
- 3. Foreign bodies
- 4. Topical medicines (for the skin)
- 5. Heart medicines

### Most common exposures, children 6-19 years:

- 1. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 2. Heart medicines
- 3. *(tie)* Sedatives and antipsychotics Stimulants and street drugs
- 4. *(tie)* Alcohols
  Antihistamines

### Most common exposures, adults 20-59 years:

- 1. *(tie)* Analgesics (pain relievers)
  Sedatives and antipsychotics
- 3. Alcohols
- 4. Stimulants and street drugs
- 5. Antidepressants

### Most common exposures, adults 60 years and older:

- 1. Heart medicines
- 2. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 3. Alcohols
- 4. *(tie)* Pesticides
