Most common exposures, children under 6 years:

- 1. Cosmetics and personal care products
- 2. Household cleaning products
- 3. Foreign bodies
- 4. *(tie)* Analgesics (pain relievers) Antihistamines

Most common exposures, children 6-12 years:

- 1. Stimulants and street drugs
- (tie) Analgesics (pain relievers) Antihistamines Asthma medicines Mushrooms

Most common exposures, children 13-19 years:

- 1. Antidepressants
- 2. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 3. Cold and cough medicines
- (tie) Antihistamines Sedatives and antipsychotics Stimulants and street drugs

Most common exposures, adults 20-59 years:

- 1. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 2. Sedatives and antipsychotics
- 3. *(tie)* Antidepressants Bites and stings
- 5. Alcohols

Most common exposures, adults 60 years and older:

- 1. Heart medicines
- (tie) Anticonvulsants Hormones (including antidiabetic and thyroid medicines) Sedatives and antipsychotics
