- 2. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 3. Cosmetics and personal care products
- 4. Topical medicines (for the skin)
- 5. Foreign bodies

Most common exposures, children 6-19 years:

- 1. Stimulants and street drugs
- 2. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 3. (tie) Foreign bodies
 Plants

Most common exposures, adults 20-59 years:

- 1. Pesticides
- 2. (tie) Analgesics (pain relievers)

Anticonvulsants

- 3. Sedatives and antipsychotics
- 4. (tie) Bites and stings

Cosmetics and personal care products

Hormones (including antidiabetic and thyroid medicines)

Household cleaning products

Stimulants and street drugs

Most common exposures, adults 60 years and older:

- 1. Household cleaning products
- 2. Anticholinergic medicines
- 3. (tie) Several substances with only one exposure each
