Most common exposures, children under 6 years:

- 1. Cosmetics and personal care products
- 2. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 3. Household cleaning products
- 4. *(tie)* Cold and cough medicines Topical medicines (for the skin)

Most common exposures, children 6-19 years:

- 1. Heart medicines
- 2. *(tie)* Analgesics (pain relievers) Household cleaning products
- 3. Multiple substances tied with one exposure

Most common exposures, adults 20-59 years:

- 1. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 2. Stimulants and street drugs
- 3. Antihistamines
- 4. Multiple substances tied with one exposure

Most common exposures, adults 60 years and older:

- 1. (tie) Analgesics (pain relievers) Anticholinergic medicines Household cleaning products
- 4. Multiple substances tied with one exposure
