Most common exposures, children under 6 years:

- 1. Household cleaning products
- 2. (tie) Analgesics (pain relievers); Cosmetics and personal care products; Pesticides
- 5. Topical medicines (for the skin)

Most common exposures, children 6-19 years:

- 1. Antidepressants
- 2. (tie) Alcohols; Vitamins
- 5. Several substances tied with 1 exposure each

Most common exposures, adults 20-59 years:

- 1. Plants
- 2. Antidepressants
- 3. (tie) Automotive & boat products; Chemicals; Essential oils; Heart medicines; Pesticides; Stimulants and street drugs

Most common exposures, adults 60 years and older:

- 1. Cosmetics and personal care products
- 2. (tie) Anticoagulants (blood thinners); Diuretics; GI medicines (for the stomach); Heart medicines; Household cleaning products
