Most common exposures, children under 6 years:

- 1. Cosmetics and personal care products
- 2. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 3. Household cleaning products
- 4. (tie) Foreign bodies and toys; Vitamins

Most common exposures, children 6-19 years:

- 1. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 2. (tie) Antihistamines; Sedatives and antipsychotics
- 4. (tie) Antidepressants; Cosmetics and personal care products; Household cleaning products

Most common exposures, adults 20-59 years:

- 1. (tie)Analgesics (pain relievers); Household cleaning products
- 3. (tie) Antidepressants; Heart medicines
- 5. Fumes, gases & vapors

Most common exposures, adults 60 years and older:

- 1. Heart medicines
- 2. Diuretics
- 3. (tie) Analgesics (pain relievers); Antidepressants; Antimicrobials
