Most common exposures, children under 6 years:

- 1. Household cleaning products
- 2. Foreign bodies and toys
- 3. (tie) Cosmetics and personal care products; Heart medicines; Vitamins

Most common exposures, children 6-19 years:

- 1. Antidepressants
- 2. Antihistamines
- 3. (tie) Analgesics (pain relievers); Dietary supplements; Household cleaning products; Hydrocarbons; Mushrooms; Sedatives and antipsychotics; Stimulants and street drugs

Most common exposures, adults 20-59 years:

- 1. Sedatives and antipsychotics
- 2. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 3. Antidepressants
- 4. Anticonvulsants
- 5. Alcohols

Most common exposures, adults 60 years and older:

- 1. Heart medicines
- 2. Sedatives and antipsychotics
- 3. (tie) Veterinary medicines; Vitamins
- 5. Several substances tied with one exposure each
