

- The Maryland Poison Center is certified by the American Association of Poison Control Centers (AAPCC) as a regional poison center and has provided poisoning treatment advice, education, and prevention services to Marylanders since 1972.
- The mission of the Maryland Poison Center is to decrease the cost and complexity
 of poisoning and overdose care while maintaining and/or improving patient
 outcomes.
- The center is open 24 hours a day, every day of the year, and is reached by calling 1-800-222-1222.
- A quick call to the Maryland Poison Center is faster and a lot less expensive than going to the emergency room. More than 65 percent of all cases reported to the Maryland Poison Center are managed safely at home!
- Experts at the Maryland Poison Center manage approximately 39,000 cases a year, involving household cleaners, medicines, snake and spider bites, plants, and chemicals in the home and workplace.
- Pharmacists and nurses with specialized clinical toxicology training answer your calls to the **Maryland Poison Center**. They are experts who are certified by the AAPCC as Specialists in Poison Information. These twelve Specialists have over 250 years of combined experience managing poisoning and overdose cases!
- The Executive Director of the program is board certified in Clinical Toxicology. The Medical Director is board certified in Emergency Medicine and Medical Toxicology.
- The Maryland Poison Center promotes poison prevention through educational materials, programs for children and adults, and exhibits at health fairs and events. Education for health professionals is accomplished through classes, in-services, publications, and on-site training.
- Every dollar spent on poison center services saves \$13.69 in health care costs. The **Maryland Poison Center** along with the other 55 poison centers in the United States save \$1.8 billion dollars each year.
