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Most common exposures, children under 6 years:

- 1. Cosmetics and personal care products
- 2. Household cleaning products
- 3. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 4. Foreign bodies and toys
- 5. (tie) Dietary supplements; Topical medicines (for the skin)

Most common exposures, children 6-12 years:

- 1. Cosmetics and personal care products
- 2. (tie) Arts, crafts, and office supplies; Adhesives and glues; Deodorizers; Pesticides

Most common exposures, children 13-19 years:

- 1. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 2. Antidepressants
- 3. (tie) Antihistamines; Stimulants and street drugs
- 5. Sedatives and antipsychotics

Most common exposures, adults 20-59 years:

- 1. Sedatives and antipsychotics
- 2. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 3. Antidepressants
- 4. Anticonvulsants
- 5. Heart medicines

Most common exposures, adults 60 years and older:

- 1. Heart medicines
- 2. Sedatives and antipsychotics
- 3. (tie) Analgesics (pain relievers); Anticonvulsants; Antidepressants
