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Most common exposures, children under 6 years:

- 1. Foreign bodies and toys
- 2. Cosmetics and personal care products
- 3. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 4. Household cleaning products
- 5. Vitamins

Most common exposures, children 6-19 years:

- 1. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 2. Antihistamines
- 3. Several substances tied with 2 exposures each

Most common exposures, adults 20-59 years:

- 1. (tie) Fumes, gases, or vapors; Household cleaning products
- 3. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 4. Antihistamines
- 5. Antidepressants

Most common exposures, adults 60 years and older:

- 1. (tie) Heart medicines; Miscellaneous medicines
- 3. (tie) Analgesics (pain relievers); Antimicrobials; Hormones (including antidiabetic and thyroid medicines); Sedatives and antipsychotics
