Most common exposures, children under 6 years:

- 1. Cosmetics and personal care products
- 2. Foreign bodies and toys
- 3. Arts, crafts, and office supplies
- 4. (tie) Household cleaning products; Deodorizers

Most common exposures, children 6-19 years:

- 1. (tie) Analgesics (pain relievers); Antihistamines; Cold and cough medicines; Cosmetics and personal care products
- 5. Several substances tied with 1 exposure each

Most common exposures, adults 20-59 years:

- 1. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 2. Household cleaning products
- 3. (tie) Cold and cough medicines; Chemicals; Sedatives and antipsychotics

Most common exposures, adults 60 years and older:

- 1. Analgesics (pain relievers)
- 2. Heart medicines
- 3. Hormones (including antidiabetic and thyroid medicines)
- 4. Several substances tied with 1 exposure each
